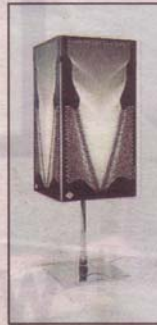
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TAKE IT HOME

Madeleine Lim finds the coolest dustpan and brush in town

This No 3 Medusa Table Lamp is a Luc Gensollen design, and available at the Oxfordshire lighting specialist Cameron Peters. Gensollen set up his small shop in Paris six years ago, using translucent mother boards from vintage PCs as shades for table lamps, wall lights and chandeliers. Because mother boards built after the year 2000 are opaque, and vintage ones are hard to find, Luc Gesnollen now designs similar-styled panels himself in order to create his graphic designs. *No 3. This Derin Rank unit was designed in 2004 by Bülend Özden and is available in wood, matt lacquer and polished lacquer from Key London, the West End shop which sells a carefully selected collection of contemporary interior furnishings.
